

Meena Bazaars, introduced during the Mughal era, also known as Kuhs Ruz "Day of Joy" were exclusively held for elite class women. Emperor Humayun was the first to organize them, but Akbar and his successors made them more elaborate. The fair was not meant for the public, while the Royal women, Rajput ladies and the wives and daughters of the noblemen in the society, set up their own stalls to sell cloths, jewellery, handicrafts etc. Only the emperor, princesses and some nobles were allowed to enter the bazaar to purchase the goods, which were exclusively sold at elite prices.
